



Discover POPLAR BLUFF

In the southeast lowlands of Missouri, a new county was established in 1849. It was formed from the lower half of Wayne County, an area too large to meet the growing needs of all its residents. The new county, approximately 36 miles long and 26 miles wide, sits in the foothills of the Ozark Mountains. And an interesting county it was. The land was covered with swamplands and forests of hardwood trees. It was sparsely settled by families from Kentucky, Tennessee, Illinois, and Indiana. Unlike the French and German settlers in Missouri, these were primarily folks of English, Scotch, and Irish ancestry - hardworking, brave farmers looking for a better life for their families.

The county was named for one of the heroes of these people, native of Kentucky, Gen. William O. Butler. William Orlando Butler was a member of a family of military distinction. His grandfather, Thomas Butler, was a Revolutionary War hero. Thomas' five sons also served in the Revolutionary War and were known as "the Gallant Butlers." One of these five, Percival, was the father

of William O. Butler.

Following the war, Percival was sent to Carrollton, Ky., as adjutant general (non-military) to the territory, and there he and his family made their home. William distinguished himself in the War of 1812 by rising from private to major. At the time Butler County was organized, Gen. Butler was at the peak of his popularity for his service in the war with Mexico, in which he served as a major general. He was commander of all American armies in Mexico. Gen. Butler was a lawyer by profession. He ran for Vice President on the Democratic ticket with Presidential Candidate Lewis Cass in 1848. They were defeated by Zachary Taylor, also a Mexican War hero, and Millard Fillmore.


General Butler died in 1880 at the age of 90. The general is honored in his home state by a state park named for him. The General Butler State Resort Park is between Louisville and Cincinnati at Carrollton on Highway I-75. The nineteenth century historic Butler-Turpin home is in the park and contains the furnishings of the Butler family. People and trees are

the sources of most of the names of towns, villages, and communities in Butler County. We began with the county, named for an illustrious man.

Poplar Bluff was an uninhabited bluff on Black River on which to place the town that would contain their governing offices, and they named it for the beautiful poplar trees that grew profusely on that bluff. They called it Poplar Bluff and they set out to build a town, their county seat. By the end of 1850, a town had been started and some ten families lived in Poplar Bluff. In 1855, the first courthouse was built and the town grew, and finally, on February 9, 1870, Poplar Bluff was incorporated.

Geographically, Poplar Bluff sits in the middle of some very interesting and diverse topography, with low lying agricultural land to the south and east and the Ozark Foothills, featuring the iconic Mark Twain National Forest, to the north and west. Welcome to Poplar Bluff, Missouri, the "Gateway to the Ozarks."

Mark Twain National Forest

The Poplar Bluff Ranger District, headquartered in Poplar Bluff, Missouri, contains 150,000 acres open to the public for hiking, camping, hunting, bird watching, bike riding, and canoeing. The District is well known for its fall foliage. The Poplar Bluff Ranger District manages several developed recreation areas: Pinewoods Lake is one mile west of Ellsinore, Missouri on Highway 60. Camping, picnicking, and fishing are permitted here. Markham Springs Recreation Area, located three miles west of Williamsville, Missouri on State Route 49, is a concession operated area providing hiking, camping, picnicking, and boat access to Black River. The newest recreation area in the Poplar Bluff Ranger District is the Hendrickson Boat Launch and Trailhead. Located ten miles north of Poplar Bluff on Highway 67, this facility provides boat access to the river pools near Williamsville Stone Plant.

The Ozark Trail

The Ozark Trail is a hiking, backpacking, and, in many places, biking and equestrian trail in the Missouri Ozarks. It is intended to reach from St. Louis to Arkansas. It has mountains, hills, and knobs, valleys filled with springs, crystal-clear streams, shut-ins and waterfalls, is trimmed by bluffs and riddled with caves. It has hardwood forests, stands of pines, savannas filled with black-eyed susans and deer, turkey, bobcats, bears, songbirds, and bald eagles. It is one of the most diverse places on the planet. Experience this natural treasure yourself on the Ozark Trail.

The trail offers trips from just a few miles to 230 miles, so spend a lazy afternoon at Taum Sauk visiting Mina Sauk Falls or a week backpacking along the Current and Eleven Point Rivers. It's guaranteed to take away the stress and leave a smile on your face.

Poplar Bluff Parks

Poplar Bluff is home to several parks with amenities such as playgrounds, walking trails, pavilions, and recreational opportunities. Both Hendrickson Park and Kiwanis Bacon Memorial Park offer disc golf courses. Wiseman Park, and the Dog Park are located in the historic downtown district, includes two fenced in areas, one for small dogs and one for larger dogs. The play areas also have obstacles for your pet to show off their skills and abilities. Pavilions can be found at Bacon, Whiteley, and Hendrickson Parks. Whiteley Park is also home to soccer and baseball fields and McLane Park houses a baseball complex.

Downtown Poplar Bluff is also home to a 19,000 square foot plaza skateboard park plaza. You can also find Ray Clinton Park downtown, which hosts the county fair and rodeos. Poplar Bluff is also home to two golf courses; city-owned and operated Ozark Ridge Golf Course, and privately-owned Westwood Hills Country Club.

Trails can be found at McLane Park (0.28 and 0.91 mile loops), Hendrickson Park (0.56 mile loop), Kiwanis Bacon Memorial Park (0.49 mile loop), and Ferguson Grove Park (0.26 mile loop). An additional 4.5 miles of trail can be found along the newly constructed Shelby Road. Construction is soon set to begin on connecting this city trail system with an additional 20+ miles of National Forest trail.

Wolf Creek Trail

Wolf Creek Trail is a mountain bike trail system approximately 21 miles in length in partnership between the Forest Service and the Poplar Bluff Parks and Recreation Department. The trail is open for mountain biking, hiking, and running.



Nature's Backyard and the Gateway to The Ozarks

With over 140 miles of trail within 40 miles of Poplar Bluff, it's no wonder the city considers itself "Nature's Backyard."

The sprawling Mark Twain National Forest sits just outside Poplar Bluff, Missouri, with Poplar Bluff serving as the district's headquarters. The 150,000 acres of land are open to the public for hiking, camping, hunting, bird watching, bike riding and canoeing and provides multiple boat access points.

The famed Ozark Trail is a hiking, backpacking, and, in many places, biking and equestrian trail in the Missouri Ozarks. It has mountains, hills and knobs, valleys filled with crystal-clear streams, shut-ins, and waterfalls. It's trimmed by bluffs and riddled with caves to be explored. This trek of land is home to deer, turkey, bobcats, bears, songbirds, and bald eagles.

Don't forget about Wolf Creek Trail, a favorite among most locals. This 21-mile mountain bike trail system is in partnership between the Forest Service and Poplar Bluff Parks and Recreation Department. It's open for mountain biking, hiking, and running. It's also home to a variety of events such as the Annual Wolf Creek Trail Run 6K and half-marathon.

If you're looking for ways to spend a leisurely afternoon, take a one-mile stroll down the beautiful boardwalks of Mingo National Wildlife Refuge. You'll find yourself immersed in the flora and fauna while spotting indigenous species such as river otter, bowfin, bald eagles, and more. Or enjoy the scenic views along the lake at Lake Wappapello State Park with four moderate trails ranging from 0.7 to 12.75 miles in length.

Prefer the action of ATV riding? The Ozark Foothills features miles of amazing gravel roads and trails, which travel through unbelievable terrain that connect many points of interests such as lakes, rivers, and springs.

BIG SPRING

Big Spring State Park is the largest spring in Missouri and one of the largest springs in the world with a daily discharge of 286 millions of gallons on average! It was also one of Missouri's first state parks. It was a state park from 1924 until 1969 when the people of Missouri donated it, along with Alley and Round Spring State Parks to the National Park Service to become a part of the Ozark National Scenic Riverways.

The Big Spring area contains the Big Spring of course, but also a campground, a picnic area, a dining lodge, trails and housekeeping cabins. It is easily located four miles south of Van Buren at the end of State Route 103.

The spring can be seen from the parking area, and a wheelchair accessible walkway leads right to it. The accessible Slough Trail is nearby, along with several other trails that are not suitable for wheelchairs. Big Spring Campground has sites for tents as well as RVs. Some have electric hook-ups and some do not.

EAGLE SKY

Eagle Sky Christian Camps has 5,000 acres nestled in the beautiful Ozarks of Missouri that serves as a breathtaking backdrop for an experience unlike any other. Located in Piedmont, MO. Experience close encounters with elk, bison, and longhorn cattle. There are canoes, kayaks, paddlebaords, water zipling, a trapeze swing, inflatables and blobs. Sure to create memorable and exciting adverntures.

SAM A. BAKER STATE PARK

It only takes a few minutes to fall in love with Sam A. Baker State Park. The cool waters of the St. Francis River and Big Creek frame a wooded setting with trails that range from easy to challenging. Ancient mountains, towering trees, and fresh air are hallmarks of the park. Rustic cabins, a campground, a separate campground for equestrians, and a lodge with good country cookin' round out the Sam A. Baker experience. With over 5,000 acres, Sam A. Baker is one of the oldest parks in the Missouri state park system. It offers visitors opportunities for camping, canoeing, fishing, and foot and horseback riding trails.

GREER SPRING AND TRAIL

A popular day hike for Forest visitors. Greer Spring is the second largest spring in Missouri. Its average daily flow of 222 million gallons more than doubles the size of the Eleven Point National Scenic River into which it flows. The spring flows from two outlets about 250 feet apart at the bottom of a steep, shaded ravine at the terminus of the trail. The spring run drops 62 feet in elevation for 1.25 miles where it runs into the Eleven Point National Scenic River. The mill and surrounding land is privately owned and not available for public use. Access to Greer Spring is via a 0.9 mile trail that descends about 250 feet in elevation along a gentle gradient from the trailhead at Missouri Highway 19. The overstory of trees, includes a variety of oaks, shortleaf pine, hickory, maples, basswood, and black gum. The spring flows from the mouth of Greer Spring Cave and boils up from the rugged bed of the spring branch. Flowing down a rock filled canyon for one mile, the spring branch enters the Eleven Point River. There is no fishing, boating, floating or wading allowed in the spring branch.

LON SANDERS CANYON

Lon Sanders Canyon is a forest area with shut-ins on McKenzie Creek and an interpretive hiking trail. They offer birdwatching, fishing (sunfish), deer and turkey hunting, and hiking trails. The total area consists of 130 acres.

OTTER SLOUGH

This area contains 2,200 acres of wetlands as well as cropland, forest and old fields. Facilities/features include: a concrete boat ramp, 21 unimproved boat ramps, primitive camping, picnic areas, three fishing jetties, a fishing dock, Otter Lake, Cypress Lake, Otter Lake Natural Area and Bradyville Natural Area. In Stoddard County, travel west of Dexter on Route 60, then 10 miles south on Route ZZ to County Road 675. Turn west on 675 and travel two miles to the area entrance.


KEENER SPRINGS

Just 15 minutes north of Poplar Bluff sits the largest privately owned spring in the State of Missouri, emitting 28,000,000 gallons of water per day! The 65-acre property is nestled on the banks of beautiful Black River with the Spring Pond and unique, water-filled cave as the focal points. Whether you plan an overnight camping-float trip or want to spend a few hours on the river, Keener Springs Cabin and Canoe Rental can provide everything you need.

OAMP ALLEN

Camp Allen is located in Greenville, MO and sits on 77.58 acres, which allows for a multitude of activities to do on spacious and safe grounds. They are a non-profit organization. Camp Allen is a Christian camp that allows bookings for retreats. The purpose of Camp Allen is to provide a ministry in evangelism, Christian education, fellowship, leadership training, and a fun Christian camping experience.

Camp Allen provides a Christian camp experience for a range of age groups. During the summer camps, spiritual growth, life building skills, arts and crafts, and personal enrichment classes are offered. Worship service is held each night and, for your safety, a qualified nurse and trained counselors are onsite at each camp.



ALLEY SPRING

Alley Spring, the natural area's namesake, is the seventh largest spring in Missouri. The spring conduit is known to extend at least 3,000 feet underground and reaches at least 155 feet below the surface. Rainfall and runoff entering sinkholes around the town of Summersville, 15 miles to the northwest, has been determined to enter the labyrinth of cave passageways formed in dissolved dolomite (a type of limestone) under the Missouri Ozarks and exit at Alley Spring. Just outside of the natural area is Alley Spring gristmill that was built in 1984.

Despite the historic use of the spring to power a mill, Alley Spring has retained its biological integrity. The cool waters issuing forth from Alley Spring flow through a spring branch for a half-mile before entering the Jacks Fork River.

MARKHAM SPRINGS

Markham Springs Campground is set on the Black River in a scenic and historic recreation area in the southwestern corner of Missouri's Mark Twain National Forest. The area provides access to multiple trails and recreational opportunities. Markham Springs Recreational Area gets its name from former owner, M.J. Markham,

who acquired the property in 1901 and operated a lumber mill at the site until the 1930's.

The Fuchs House, a five-bedroom concrete and native stone home, also sits on the property, along with a neighboring mill. At times, it is also available for rent.

River and stream fishing are popular activities near the campground. The Black River boasts bass, sunfish, walleye, and catfish. Many anglers fish from boats, but others fish from the riverbanks. Canoeing and kayaking are also possible on the river.

BOZE MILL

Boze Mill Float Camp is the only float camp along the Eleven Point River that can be accessed from either the river or by car. Located at approx. river mile 33.5, Boze Mill is about 2.6 miles downstream from the Greenbriar Float Camp, or about 2.1 miles upstream from Riverton Access.


Boze Mill Spring forms a beep blue pool as it emerges from underground, producing between 12-14 million gallons of water per day on average. Many different aquatic plants can been seen around the spring and spring branch. As the spring branch makes its way towards

the Eleven Point River, it passes through an old hand-layered rock wall, remnants from the Lucas Boze grist mill from the late 1800s. An old turbine, as well as the rock wall, are all that remain from the old mill.

Primitive camping is the main feature of this area for floaters. Scattered picnic tables area also available, as well as pedestal grills, and a centrally located vault toilet. This is also a great spot to do some fishing, especially for bass, rainbow trout or pan fish. Wade fishing can be done here, but often times the water is cold and the current swift.

ROCKY FALLS

Few places in the Ozarks provide a glimpse of earth's turbulent past as well as Rocky Falls. The reddish-brown rock you see here is rhyolite porphyry. It formed as molten rock deep within the earth and flowed onto the surface about 1.5 billion years ago. At the time, no living thing existed to see the awesome flow of glowing hot lava slowly advancing over the barren landscape. Normally, a stream eroding softer dolomite, a type of limestone, would make a wider valley for itself. Since the rhyolite is harder, the stream tends to stay within whatever cracks that it finds, deepening them only a little by erosion. Thus



a"shut in" is formed where the harder rock has "shut in" the stream. Farther downstream, past the constricting rhyolite, the stream valley widens once again. This allows the stream to expand into a pool. Rocky Falls can be visited year round. It is located on Route NN, off of Route H east of

Eminence and Winona. It has a walking trail, bathrooms, picnic tables and fire grills.

PECK RANCH CONSERVATION AREA

Peck Ranch consists of 23,763 acres of rugged, forested hills and hollows. Limestone and rhyolite glades provide natural openings among the oak-pine forest that dominates the region. Narrow ridges range from 900 to 1,000 feet in elevation. The area's highest point is Stegall Mountain, 1,348 feet above sea level. Rogers Creek and Mill Creek, which flow into the Current River, meander through the area. Peck Ranch is home to Missouri's wild elk cohort as well as a vast diversity of other wildlife. A visit to Peck Ranch brings opportunity to view White-tailed deer, wild turkeys, song birds, and many other native species. Diverse management techniques are used to maintain and restore the many natural communities on Peck Ranch. located on Route NN, off of Route H east of Eminence and Winona. It has a walking trail, bathrooms, picnic tables and fire grills.

CLEARWATER LAKE

The US Army Corps of Engineers completed construction of the Clearwater Lake Dam in 1948, with the prime purpose of maintaining flood control for the Black River drainage around the Poplar Bluff region. At a conservation pool of 1,630 acres, the lake is a great size for recreational and fishing boats up to 30' long, with a keel depth of 1.5' or less. At maximum flood level, the lake increases over six times in size to 10,350 acres. The Corps of Engineers maintains a summer pool at 498', and a winter pool at 494'.

Clearwater has plenty to offer visitors. Fishing is primarily focused

on the spring and winter spawn, and crappie and catfish during the summer months. The Corps periodically drops trees in the lake to provide fish habitat. During the summer months the lake becomes a recreational playground, with boating enthusiasts hitting the water primarily during the weekends. Pulling water toys, skiing, wake boarding, and knee boarding are popular activities that elicit shrieks of glee on all areas of the lake. The weekday visitor can find that the lake is quite peaceful and not quite as busy. Most of the dedicated fishermen leave the lake to the "weekenders" then hit the fishing holes during the weekdays. The Corps maintains several hiking trails around the lake, and a biking trail at the River Road campground.


Also at the River Road campground is a tournament volleyball pit, as well as basketball courts, playgrounds, and a great view of the spillway. Golfing enthusiasts can the Canyon Club Golf Course in Piedmont, while hikers can visit the nearby Lon Sanders Canyon Conservation Area for a scramble over the shut-ins of McKenzie Creek. At night time, the casual visitor only has to gaze upwards to see sights that are simply not available in the big towns as the Milky Way comes out to dance in the skies. A popular time to visit is during August 11-13 to view the biggest celestial event of the year - the Perseid Meteor Shower. With upwards of 100 meteors per hour, the clear skies of Clearwater Lake makes for a memorable evening.

ECHO BLUFF

The new Echo Bluff State Park is the complete, quintessential Missouri Ozark destination. As your Basecamp for Ozark Adventures, Echo Bluff State Park is the perfect combination of a remote location and connected accessibility to the best of the Ozarks. With the Current River a half-mile away, Echo Bluff State Park is set in a valley surrounded by towering bluffs, unsullied forest and cut by the Sinking Creek (the Current River's second largest tributary).

Echo Bluff State Park and the surrounding areas are ideal for outdoor activities. Fill your days floating down cool, crystal waters. Tackle some of the best smallmouth bass fishing in the Midwest. Enjoy kayaking, mountain biking, and of course, hiking miles of scenic trails ideal for both serious backpackers longing to explore the rugged backcountry and families looking for a serene day hike. Or you just may prefer to relax in the shadow of the park's namesake, Echo Bluff. This sheer, monumental geologic wonder made of Eminence dolomite rises hundreds of feet above Sinking Creek. It is a stunning, one-of-akind panorama that amazes all park visitors and overnight guests.











Downtown POPLAR BLUFF

BUILDING AN ECONOMIC, HISTORIC, AND FAMILY-FRIENDLY CULTURAL CENTER.



ormed in early 2010, Downtown Poplar Bluff, Inc. was created as a result of the needs and recommendations identified through Missouri's DREAM (Downtown Revitalization and Economic Assistance in Missouri) program. The city succeeded in a statewide compétitive process in 2007, when Missouri's governor honored Poplar Bluff by naming it a DREAM city. DREAM cities from throughout Missouri participate in a three-year program that provides state support to create and implement long-term downtown revitalization plans.

Downtown Poplar Bluff hosts several events throughout the year. The largest of these events is the Iron Horse Festival. The Annual Iron Horse Festival, which takes place the last Saturday of each September. The event began to celebrate the history of the railroad in our community.

Smaller events such as Witches Crawl, The Downtown Open House, Dining for Downtown, and Hafftoberfest also take place downtown. Downtown Poplar Bluff, Inc. hosts the annual 4th of July firework display show, which kicks off right at dusk. Two parades with routes centered around downtown take place on the 4th

of July and the first Friday in December. The River Radio Lighted Parade is coupled with a community tree lighting at the Black River Coliseum. These events draw several thousands of people to our downtown throughout the year to showcase what businesses and amenities are currently there and what is to come.

As of May 2022, there are two large sections of Vine Street lit with Edison lights strung above the street providing the bricks with a warm glow at night to accommodate night life. Downtown Poplar Bluff, Inc. would like to continue the lights and complete the street. Much of the organization's fundraising attempts

Poplar Bluff is the county seat, which makes downtown home to a large, beautiful courthouse that overlooks the historic district.

Downtown is home to several locally owned restaurants, cafes, and bars with more continuing to be added each year.





The Fairfield Inn & Suites is right off the highway for easy access. Big Whiskey's American Restaurant & Bar, is adjacent to the hotel, only a few steps away. The Fairfield Inn & Suites is also next to a shopping center and other food options that are within walking distance. The hotel offers free wifi, free parking, free breakfast buffet, an indoor pool, a fitness center, a business center, an outdoor patio with a grill and a market to buy snacks, frozen meals and drinks.

BLACK RIVER COLISEUM

The Black River Coliseum is in historic downtown Poplar Bluff, Missouri along the banks of the celebrated Black River. It is just minutes away from tourist attractions, shopping, restaurants, and motels and is easily accessible from St. Louis, Branson, Memphis, Little Rock and Springfield.

This 115,000 sq. ft. multi-purpose facility houses concerts, sporting events, family shows, trade shows, conventions, and banquets, just to name a few. It has a seating capacity of 5,000 for concerts, 4,500 for sporting events and 4,000 for rodeos, as well as numerous other areas to accommodate business meetings, training classes, receptions, and seminars. New renovations to the lobby coming soon.

HISTORIC RODGERS THEATRE

The Historic Rodgers Theatre originally opened June 1st 1949, with a great deal of fanfare and showing the movie "Red Canyon". 1,800 people attended the opening festivities including a ribbon cutting, music by the Poplar Bluff Municipal Band and a dedication to the city mayor. E.W. Robinson.

The theatre was reported to be the finest between St. Louis and Memphis at the time it opened. It was fully air conditioned and warmed by forced air and radiant heat.

The building occupies 11,648 sq. ft. At opening, it contained 1,160 red plush seats, and there was also a cry room for small children and their mothers. The marquee was brilliantly lit which still displays red letters that spell the name of the theatre. Movie goers entered the lobby through solid walnut doors. Leather benches lined one of the walls of the lobby.

The owners, Kerasotes Theatres, gave the building to Butler county in January 1999 when they moved to a new multiplex theater on 67 South.

Today the 1,000 person capacity theatre is currently being renovated and is operated by the Rodgers Theatre (nonprofit) group, which hosts concerts, comedians, magicians and much more. You can also rent out the theatre for meetings, wedding receptions, and private screenings. The Theatre is located at 204 North Broadway Street, in historic downtown Poplar Bluff.



TINNIN FINE ARTS CENTER

The Tinnin Fine Arts Center houses a recently remodeled concert-quality, 500-seat theater. It has hosted national touring productions of ballet and modern dance, plays and musicals, band and choir performances, acrobats, and musical performers from opera tenors to bluegrass pickers. It is home to Center Stage, a blended theater company of students, college employees, and community members, who perform Broadway-quality productions.

The Tinnin Gallery features artwork of students, alumni, and regional artists. The Center also houses classrooms, studios, and faculty offices for the English, Music, Art, Language, and Public Speaking departments.

POPLAR BLUFF MUNICIPAL LIBRARY

The Poplar Bluff Municipal Library houses a variety of events from Theater Thursdays to Sunday Movie Matinees. They also host author fairs and classes for adults, children and teens.

MARGARET HARWELL ART MUSEUM

The Margaret Harwell Art Museum in Poplar Bluff, Missouri owes its existence to the generosity of its namesake and benefactor, Margaret Harwell - an amateur artist, businesswoman, and civic leader. When Mrs. Harwell died in 1977, she left a part of her estate to the City of Poplar Bluff to establish a center for art classes and exhibits. In 1978, an Arts and Museum Advisory Board was formed to take on the task. In 1980, the city purchased the J.L. Dalton home, itself rich in local history and architecture, to house the museum. The Margaret Harwell Art Museum opened to the public in November 1981. The museum is located on the historic brick streets in the heart of the city at 421 N. Main Street and tours are free.

POPLAR BLUFF HISTORY MUSEUM

The Poplar Bluff Museum is housed in the old Mark Twain School building located at 1010 North Main Street. This building is called Mark Twain because construction started the same year Mark Twain died, 1910.

The building closed as a school after the 1987-88 school year. The Poplar Bluff School District and its superintendent, Dr. Robert O. Moulton sold the property to the City of Poplar Bluff to be used as a museum. A group of dedicated citizens, headed by

Sam Giambelluca, began renovating the building to serve as a museum.

It currently houses The Poplar Bluff Sports Hall of Fame, Abington Haworth School House, Butler County Historical Society, Kanell Hall Veterans Museum and the Hall of Heroes, Githens Hall, Postal Room, Dale Gaebler Poplar Bluff People, The Scout Room, US Forest Service and Missouri Conservation Commission, Bowling Hall of Fame, Telephone Pioneers, Medical Museum, and Golf Museum. The building was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1998.

THE CLAUDIA HOUSE, AN ENGLISH MANOR

Founded in 1989 and funded by Poplar Bluff native, Linda Bloodworth Thomason, writer, director producer. It was named in honor of her late mother, Claudia Bloodworth. An English Company — Artisans of Crowther of Syon Lodge (the same company that rebuilt the war ravaged Windsor Castle in the 1660's) constructed the giant library in London, disassembled it, and sent it by ship to New Orleans. It was then sent by barge up the Mississippi river to Cape Girardeau, Mo. and trucked the last 60 miles to Poplar Bluff. The builders came from London and spent over six months in Poplar Bluff reassembling the library. One of the workers remarked it was, "the best adventure of his life!" They loved Poplar Bluff and several have been back for visits over the years.

The Claudia Foundation currently operates the Claudia House, located at 626 Cynthia Street, and their purpose is to promote positive change in the lives of individuals, especially women. The Claudia House is a place for celebrations, weddings, town meetings, corporate gatherings, birthdays, and even funerals. The Claudia House may be reserved for special event bookings by organizations and individuals.

FLYING F GALLERY

The flying "F" Gallery is located in the historic Collins Family farmhouse, built circa 1894. The building was converted into a country general store in 1926 and remained open until 1978. Missouri artist Ralph Wayne Freer's captivating works of art can be found in the century old farmhouse which he has converted into the Flying "F" Gallery. Both his gallery and studio are located on Highway "W" near Poplar Bluff, Missouri.

Although Ralph's Ozark roots include being born in a Civil War era log house

he has had the good fortune to travel and live in Europe, Central America, and throughout the United States. He believes these experiences have shaped and influenced his approach to life and art. Ralph is primarily a sculptor working in wood. His artistic style is a continually evolving three-dimensional impressionism. He focuses on the exploration of shapes, forms, and color. As with most artists Ralph is intense about his art. His formal training includes life drawings with Malcolm Ross and portrait sculpture with Jane Doxey, both in Key West, Florida.

WHEATLEY SCHOOL AND BLACK HISTORY MUSEUM

The need for a public African American school was recognized in 1901 in Butler County, Missouri. The school was named for the poetess Phyllis Wheatley. In 1928 the building was expanded from four rooms to eight rooms with a library and gymnasium. Early in 1950 a vocational building was added. The school was the center of education for African Americans from its inception until the R-I school district became integrated in 1968. It later served as a grade school and early childhood center until closing in 2001.

Stars and Stripes Museum

Just a short, 25 minute drive from Poplar Bluff, is the National Stars and Stripes Museum/Library is a nonprofit educational institution, which is

dedicated to collecting, documenting, and preserving materials related to the creation and continued history of the Stars and Stripes military newspaper. By preserving and interpreting the Stars and Stripes and making its archives available, the museum and library seek to enhance the public's understanding and appreciation of the newspaper's role in American and world history. There was little peace in the small town of Bloomfield, Missouri between November 7, 1861, when Brigadier General Ulysses Grant ordered federal soldiers to destroy the pro-southern Missouri State Guard troops of Brig. Gen. M. Jeff Thompson, and September 1864 when bushwhackers left the town in ashes. During this time, control of the town changed over twenty times, Union troops shelled the town and printed the first issue of the military newspaper, The Stars and Stripes. Their officers staged a mutiny, several executions took place, and 6000 cavalrymen camped here at the Union prepared to join the campaign to capture Little Rock, Arkansas. Markers that tell the town's Civil War story have been placed at or near the sites where the event's happened. Stop by the museum and pick up a brochure of the Driving Tour of the Stars and Stripes Historic-Cultural Byway.

VETERANS MEMORIAL WALL

The Veteran's Memorial Wall, located at 301 S. 5th Street in front of the Black River Coliseum, is a monument dedicated to the perpetual celebration

of men and women who have served our country through the military. It consists of black granite panels, mounted on solid concrete, on which names of veterans are inscribed. The walkway in front of the wall is constructed of brick. The center section of the Memorial is constructed of a concrete base for the four flagpoles that fly the National, State, City, and POW-MIA flags. Also included in this area are granite pylons mounted on solid concrete for inscribing names of veterans killed in action and are illuminated during the hours of darkness. The Wall is 100 feet long with two 32 feet tapered sides angling towards Fifth street. It has 89 black granite panels, ranging from 2' x 7' in size down to the smaller tapered panels along each angling side. All panels will contain names. There are 43 large panels, which will contain approximately 132 names each, and there are 16 half-size panels that will contain approximately 66 names each.

MO-ARK REGIONAL RAILROAD MUSEUM

Poplar Bluff can credit its early growth to the railroading industry, linking our city with other major locations: Dallas, Little Rock, Memphis, St. Louis, Chicago, Detroit, or west to Springfield and Kansas City. The timber industry was the initial reason for establishment of the railway system. The influx of people, seeking jobs in this area, increased the need for machinery, food, clothing and other items needed for population

growth. When the timber industry declined, farming became a major need for transportation. Cross-country railroads continue to provide the most economical mode of transportation. On your visit to the museum, you will see Model Train displays; photographs of early railroading days which depict logging, lumber mills, factories, area train depots, the early steam engine, a dining car display, a train bell, workman's railroad maintenance tools and the old depot pot-belly stove.

BRICK'S OFF ROAD PARK

After four generations of farming corn to cattle the Brickells decided to turn their family farm into a 4-wheel-drive-heaven. Brick's Off Road Park is open to any and all types of off-road vehicles from 4-Wheelers, to dirt bikes, to dune buggies, it even has some technical up hill and rock climbs for the experienced Rock Crawlers.

Brick's is open on specific event

weekends throughout the year and primitive camping is available. Their Trucks Gone Wild annual event is one of the largest mud events in the country. The farm has the spring-fed Beaver Dam Creek running through it, a new super road known as the "Main Loop", and a mud Slough that is sure to give even the biggest of trucks out there a great run for their money. Jay's son, Scott, who currently lives in Nashville, has helped turn the farm into one of the country's best off road parks. The terrain at the farm, which is located south of Poplar Bluff (2181 County Road 484) near Lone Hill is perfect for this type of recreation. The rolling hills, and creeks, along with the wavy fields provide plenty of scenery for pleasure-riding or tough challenges, whichever fits your mood that day.

POPLAR BLUFF MOTORSPORTS PARK

Located at 1989 Speedway Dr. in Poplar Bluff Missouri is the Poplar Bluff Motorsports Park. It is a 3/8 mile high banked clay oval dirt track. They have races every Saturday night throughout the race season. They offer many race options, such as: B-Mods plus A-Mods, Factory Stocks, Mini Cruisers, POWRi Street Stocks, ModLites, and Super Cruisers. The park provides a fun family friendly atmosphere for everyone. Enjoy the action packed races while your children can stay occupied at the playground or the free arcade. Pit gates open at 2:30 pm on Saturdays and hot laps are at 6:30 sharp. The Poplar Bluff Motorsports Park has three goals: Keep racing fun and affordable; Make sure it's an entertaining show for our new and loyal fans; Start on time and finish the night in a timely manner!

The park also features a new scoreboard and transponder system for scoring. The Transponder system is linked to MY RACE PASS so results and lineups are quick and efficient. They also have a monitor in the pits that show line ups. You can put your flashlights and reading glasses away when looking at the line up board!

THE CAMP AT LAKE WAPPAPELLO

The Camp at Lake Wappapello is your family's outdoor dream destination. Located along the Southern border of Southeast Missouri's Wappapello Lake, The Camp at Lake Wappapello is set on 160 acres of wilderness and is designed to let you enjoy the comfort of your own home while still giving you easy access to campground amenities and proximity to all kinds of exciting outdoor destinations.

The Camp Amenities include restaurant and store, 52 RV sites, custom designed cabins, primitive campsites, band stand with local entertainment, children's playground, volleyball area, basketball court, carriage rides, shuttle services, conference center, nature trails, trail riding, bath house, rentals (golf carts, canoes, kayaks), wifi, and much more.

OTAHKI LAKE CABINS AND CAMPGROUND

Over 1,200 acres of beautiful Ozark Mountains located in Patterson, Missouri offering camping, cabin rentals, primitive camping, RV hook ups, glamping, river access, and also lake swimming.

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


Homebrew enthusiasts will compete for the prestigious "People's Choice" award, and each participant will receive one ticket to cast their vote for their favorite homebrew creation.

KING DAVID'S WINERY & MEADERY

In the foothills of the Ozarks bordering the Mark Twain National Forest atop a hill overlooking the enchanted Wolf Creek Valley you'll find King David's Winery, Meadery & Brewery. A public house with a focus on high quality food, wine, mead, and beer. Owner and operator, David Peluso, has won state, national and even world competitions for his beer. King David's is located just a short 3 miles outside of Poplar Bluff, on 1844 County Road 448. He orders shipments of hops and other grains for beers from St. Louis and beyond. For mead, which is honey-based, he buys from local beekeepers as well as importing exotic varieties from India, Mexico, and South America.

The brewery features large screen televisions to view sporting events, an incredible view of the beautiful Wolf Creek Valley from the outdoor deck and delicious Cajun cuisine; along with the largest pretzel in the region and King David's homemade cheesecake (both local favorites). David, a native of Louisiana, is an amazing chef who grew up cooking with his family. David makes all his own beer, wine, meads and serves other nationally known spirits.

t is a story told all over the Midwest; Poplar Bluff asks their citizens to pay for a 50-mile 4 lane highway, which doesn't have a single mile in the city limits. Years ago, city leaders decided Poplar Bluff needed to be connected to population centers like St. Louis, Memphis, Little Rock, and Springfield. They asked their citizens to increase the local sales tax to fund this project, and the results have been incredible: increased safety and tremendous economic impact. Now you can drive any direction from Poplar Bluff on a divided 4 lane highway. Soon, Interstate 57 will pass through Poplar Bluff, connecting Chicago, Illinois to Little Rock, Arkansas.

From their beginning in 1956, Interstates have transformed America. They provide the safest highway while getting to destinations quickly and efficiently. Interstate 57 was completed from Chicago, Illinois to Sikeston, Missouri in 1978. In 2017, US 67 was federally designated as "Future I-57" from Little Rock, Arkansas to Walnut Ridge, Arkansas. The next year, designation was completed on US 67 from Walnut Ridge, Arkansas to Poplar Bluff, Missouri and on US 60 east through Dexter to existing I-57 at Sikeston, Missouri. In 2019, 88% of voters in Poplar Bluff favored a measure to extend the limits of the local sales tax to cover US 67 South to the Arkansas state line. The 12-mile two-lane corridor was divided into four phases starting at Route 160. By the end of 2019, state and

local funding was secured to complete Future Interstate 57 for Phases 1 and 2, extending from Route 160 south four miles.

Construction began in the summer of 2022 for the first phase, followed by Phase 2 construction in the summer of 2023. Phases 3 and 4 remain unfunded currently, but citizens remain optimistic the two-lane roadway will soon be a four-lane interstate.

UPDATE-

In the fall of 2022, the Missouri Department of Transportation broke ground on the first project that improved the Route 160 interchange and the journey to the Arkansas State line began. The next phase is scheduled to begin in late summer of 2024. This will extend the project southward approximately 4 miles to County Road 352, leaving an 8-mile gap in Missouri. The Arkansas Department of Transportation will begin a project near Corning in the Spring of 2025 and begin their journey to close the 42-mile gap in Arkansas.

The message of the Highway 67 Corporation remains: "Completing this route is absolutely important to the safety of our citizens and the continued growth and economic future of Southeast MO and Northeast Arkansas."



GENERAL AVIATION NEEDS

The Poplar Bluff Municipal Airport (KPOF) is available to accommodate the general aviation needs of the Greater Poplar Bluff area. The airport handles approximately 15,000 operations annually with a 5,000-foot runway. The airport is currently operated by City of Poplar Bluff staff and has amenities such as hangar storage, fuel, restrooms, lounge area, free parking, and a short-term vehicle service. Poplar Bluff is a little over two hours from St. Louis Lambert International Airport and Memphis International Airport.

RAIL SERVED

Poplar Bluff has a class 1 rail system, two public-use rail spurs for businesses, and is a stop for Amtrak. The local Amtrak station is located at 400 South Main Street. Amtrak's Texas Eagle travels between Chicago, Illinois and San Antonio, Texas through Poplar Bluff. Connecting service between San Antonio and Los Angeles is available

via the Sunset Limited. Poplar Bluff has a rich history in railroads and has a Mo-Ark Regional Railroad Museum, located at 303 South Moran Street.

ECO-FRIENDLY

Poplar Bluff has over 50 Bird electric scooters strategically placed around the city, providing eco-friendly transportation for riders. Poplar Bluff also has Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations available at the Poplar Bluff Chamber of Commerce and downtown for visitors traveling through the area.

CITY TRANSIT SYSTEM

SMTS operates a local, rural transit system called BATS (Bluff Area Transit Service). SMTS is a nongovernmental, non-profit public passenger transportation service. SMTS transportation services are available throughout South Central and Southeast Missouri and have been offering services since 1980. Today, SMTS provides a wide

variety of "door-to-door" passenger transportation services to all age groups. Poplar Bluff also has numerous privately-owned taxi services for travel within the city and county, as well as a couple of services which will shuttle citizens to larger cities like St. Louis.

CAR RENTAL NEEDS

Poplar Bluff has an Enterprise Rent-A-Car located at 1115 Herschel Bess Blvd. Suite B, which will take care of all your rental needs.

TRAIL SYSTEM

Poplar Bluff is a very "walkable" community, with sidewalks on all the major streets, such as Pine and Westwood Boulevard. Poplar Bluff also has over 15 miles of trails in the city limits to walk, bike, or run. Also, located just outside the city limits, is the 21-mile Wolf Creek Trail. Poplar Bluff boasts over 140 miles of trails within 40 minutes of the city; most notably the Ozark Trail.


